Progress continues to be made on repairs to bring our condemned properties into compliance with requirements of the Department of Consumer and Regulatory Affairs. The Board for the Condemnation of Insanitary Buildings at its regular meeting held on July 11, 2007 approved an extension for a period of sixty days for all work to repair and render sanitary be completed. We are currently reviewing new proposals for the completion. We sincerely thank Mr. Charles Randolph and Mr. Rufus Locks for their tireless efforts and cooperation in assisting preparations for the work to be done. We also express much gratitude to Deacon Constance Tate and Deacon

Janice Bowden for their leadership in securing your support to fund the entire project. We give God the Glory.

We have contracted Mr. Othella Mahone, Potomac Management Associates, as consultant to assist in developing further plans for the future use of our properties. Architectural plans are progressing for our Community Services building at 1531-1533 Ninth Street. If you have suggestions/recommendations for programs in this building please forward them to Trustee Gregory Prioleau.

Glory to the name of our Lord! The total donated to the Take The Signs Down Campaign as of July 22, 2007 is \$202,480.63. The faithfulness of our God, Father of all, who is over and through all, has blessed us to more than double our goal.

We continue to make progress:

- The Trustees have signed a contract for the brick, concrete and other work to be completed on the 9th Street properties at a cost of \$31,500. A deposit of \$10,500 was paid. Work on this contract was scheduled to begin on July 30, 2007.
- We still await a permit to dismantle the garage at 1528 9th Street.
- Gutter and down spout work have not yet been completed.
- The roofing repairs were completed on 1526, 1528, 1532, 1534, 1536 9th Street.
- A contract must also be negotiated and signed by the Trustees for roof repairs and interior work needed on 1543 8th Street.
