We thank God for the tremendous ways we are learning to use the newest technology to deepen our spirituality. There is no question that this Lenten season has been one of our most enriching.

We also commend our Deacons for the way they have given spiritual direction during this time leading up to Easter. Last Thursday's Lenten Pray Vigil was an example of Deacon's work at its best. In the Lectionary text from Luke 13, Jesus sites two examples of unexpected tragedies and how we never know when these things will come or from where they will come. All we can do is stay close to God. Our Deacons are leading the way in showing us all how important it is to pray continually and fervently in this world of chaos, tragedy, and suffering.

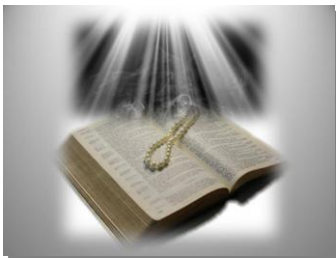

The Shiloh Senior Citizens Club (SSCC) ended an exciting year (2008-2009) on a positive note. Our mission is always before us: "To ensure that priority attention is given to addressing the needs of the senior population at Shiloh and those participants from the neighboring community . . . ." and we stay focused on our motto "Still bearing fruit. . . ." – Psalm 92:14.

We are continually generous and supportive of the ministries of Shiloh, through our individual pledges and our \$2,000 collective donation years to the Victory Campaign. Each week, the donations of canned goods and staples are instrumental in helping to maintain a well-stocked pantry. # Scholarship Opportunity



Blacks in Government® (BIG) is a professional organization for the civil service employee. BIG was organized in 1975 and incorporated as a non-profit organization under the District of Columbia's jurisdiction in 1976. BIG's goals are to promote *equity* in all aspects of American life, *excellence* in public service, and *opportunity* for all Americans. The Department of Health and Human Services (HHS)/ College Park Complex Chapter is comprised of employees of HHS and the U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) who are located in Washington, DC and College Park, Maryland. The Chapter functions as an advocacy group, an employee support group, and a resource group to promote professionalism and equal opportunity among federal employees in general and Black employees in particular. The HHS/College Park Complex Chapter is pleased to announce that it will award at least **two \$1,000 academic scholarships in 2010.**

## ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

To be considered for a scholarship, the applicant must:

- ◆ Be a graduating senior from an accredited secondary educational institution in the Washington, DC metropolitan area;
- ◆ Enter a four-year university or college as a full-time freshman in the Fall of 2010;
- ◆ Have a scholastic average of at least 2.5 on a 4.0 scale;
- ◆ Not be an immediate relative of a member of BIG HHS/College Park Complex Chapter.

## APPLICATION PROCEDURES

The application packet must include the following:

- ◆ Scholarship Application (attached).
- ◆ One recommendation from an official or teacher of the applicant's current school in an envelope sealed by the school official, with the official's signature or the school stamp *across* the sealed portion of the envelope.
- ◆ One recommendation from an official of the applicant's extracurricular activity (e.g., school activity, community organization, church, or employer) in an envelope sealed by the official, with the official's signature or the school stamp *across* the sealed portion of the envelope.
- ◆ A copy of the applicant's high school transcript in an envelope sealed by a school official, with the official's signature or the school stamp *across* the sealed portion of the envelope.
- ◆ The 2010 National Black History Month theme is "The History of Black Economic Empowerment." Please provide a typed double-spaced essay not to exceed three pages on the following topic: *Carter G. Woodson, the father of Black History Month was a forceful advocate of both African-American self-reliance and African-*

*American economic and political empowerment. It has been more than a year since Barack Obama made Black History by being elected the first African-American President of the United States. Has the election of President Obama set into motion further African-American empowerment? If so, how? If not, why not, and what can be done to further empower the African American community?*

Completed application, transcript and recommendations **must be postmarked by April 9, 2010** and returned to the address below. Final selections will be made by **May 7, 2010**. All students will be notified of their status after this date. All information is considered confidential.
