The Pastor's Pen

As we move into the fourth week of Lent, our attention begins to turn to the drama of life and death on which this season focuses.

Our Lectionary Scriptures lift this theme. In Ezekiel 37:1-4, there is the account of the dry bones, a metaphor for Israel's demise and captivity at the hands of the Babylonians. In the midst of a dry and deadly situation Ezekiel is instructed to preach to the bones with the results being they returned to life.

Psalm 130 has the author crying to God from the depths of his despair; he is in a situation so terrifying it seems like death. However, his affirmation is that it is God who will redeem all of Israel.

Romans 8:6-11 raises the philosophical understanding of death in Paul's theology. *To set the mind on the flesh is death, but to set the mind on the spirit is life.*

Finally John 11:1-45 tells the very familiar story of the raising of Lazarus from the dead. Lazarus, a dear friend of Jesus, has been dead for three days when his sisters, Mary and Martha, raised the question to Jesus *"If you had been here our brother would not have died."* Not only did Jesus raise him from the dead but used that opportunity to teach Mary and Martha, *"I am the resurrection and the life. Those who believe in me shall never die"*

On this fourth Sunday in Lent we meditate on the most fundamental question of the human experience, which Job raised in his book of the same name. *"If a man dies shall he live again?"*

The Scriptures this week answer that timeless question. As John the Revelator later said, *"Blessed are the dead who die in the Lord; so says the Spirit for they do rest from their labors and their works do follow."*

Chapter One - *The People-Focused Church*

“A market-sensitive church need not compromise on its message, but it must change its methods if it is to meet the spiritual needs of people. Excuse my soapbox a second, but a market-oriented church gives people what they need in the way they like to receive it. Seems to me, that’s what Jesus did most of the time.”

Chapter Two - *Deming Comes to Church*

The Five Star Principles

1. We want to be the best we can be, reach our potential, service people better and glorify God. To do this, we must be intentional and perpetual.
2. Let’s practice what we preach and put “thorns in our laurels.”
3. Everyone on the ministry team is involved in analyzing what we do, how we do it and how we can do it better to serve people best.
4. Who are the best people for the ministry tasks, and what are the best resources we can afford?
5. We need to discuss the Q (quality) factor when we plan a project, after an event and in our scheduled staff meetings.
6. Invest the time and money to teach, train and retrain people to develop their skills and to implement quality ministry methods
7. The leader’s job is to buy into the concept for quality concern, cast the vision and never delegate the core value.
