

APPLICATION FOR SCHOLARSHIP

Scholarship Awards: See attached listing of the available awards and the criteria therefor. To provide scholarships to as many persons as are eligible, the Scholarship Committee may grant only one award to an applicant. **Note:** *All available awards will not necessarily be awarded each year. This application cannot be used for any awards administered by the HBCU Council. You must contact the HBCU Council directly to apply for each of the awards that it administers.*

- **Academic Award—Pryde Prize** (minimum G.P.A. 3.0; non-renewable; for high school student with cumulative grade point average of at least 3.0 (on a four-point scale) for grades 9-11, and the first semester of grade 12)
- **Book Prize** (non-renewable; for high school student with cumulative grade point average of at least 2.0 (on a four-point scale) for grades 9-11 and the first semester of grade 12)
- **Carter G. Woodson** (for high school student; must submit essay)
- **Cirtie Mae Turner** (for one male and one female high school student; preference to DC residents)
- **Gospel Choir** (minimum 2.7 G.P.A.; for high school student; must submit essay)
- **Harmon Taylor** (renewable; based on financial need; for high school student)
- **Graduate Research Scholarship** (for graduate study)
- **Williams-Whitener Award** (for undergraduate or graduate study; minimum G.P.A.--2.7 for high school student applicant and B for undergraduate or graduate student)
- **Earl L. Harrison Fellowship** (nonrenewable; for Howard University School of Divinity student)

Minimum Eligibility Requirements:

- **Unless the award criteria expressly indicate otherwise, applicants must be members of Shiloh Baptist Church of Washington.**
- Applicants must be active in the school they presently attend.
- High school and university student applicants for awards must be students in good standing and meet the requirements of the specific award for which they are applying.
- High school student applicants must submit an official transcript for grades 9-11, and the first semester of grade 12.
- University student applicants must submit an official transcript for all undergraduate, graduate or professional school studies to date.
- **REMEMBER TO SUBMIT A COPY OF ALL REQUIRED TRANSCRIPTS. YOUR APPLICATION CANNOT BE CONSIDERED WITHOUT THEM.**
